Jehovah's Witnesses are a professed Christian religious organization based in the United States. The organization uses a number of law societies around the world, publishing literature and performing other operational and administrative functions that represent the interests of the religious organization. "The Society" has been used as a collective term for these societies. The Jehovah's Witness literature has also referred to religion generally as the "Christian congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses." The oldest and most important of their society is the "Watch Tower Society." Jehovah's Witnesses have maintained a distinction between their corporations and their religious organizations, including, but not limited to: Watch the Bible and Tract Society of Pennsylvania Watchtower Bible and Tract Society of New York, Inc. Australia Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society of Canada Christian Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses Based in Brooklyn , New York, Religion has more than 13,000 Kingdom Halls (Houses of Worship and Study) in the United States with 1,145,723 million members (as of 2011). Outside the membership of the United States are over 7.2 million in 96,094 theatres of the local Kingdom. All baptized members are ordained ministers and participate in the activity of preaching and teaching; there are no paid clergy. Jehovah's Witnesses were founded in the United States in the 1870s by Charles Taze Russell of Pittsburgh. A small group of nonconformist Christian Adventists who professed loyalty to the Lord alone refused to swear allegiance to any government or serve in the army of any nation. They believed that after the battle of Armageddon they would be the chosen ones in a thousand-year period of heavenly peace. They were despised for their opposition to World War I, for their door-to-door proselytism, for their contempt for the government, for their initial support for the return of Jews to the Holy Land, and for their strong criticism of the hypocrisy of other Religions. Some of these criticisms have had to do with the involvement of mainstream Christians in politics and their support for war efforts around the world which makes them corporative. They highlighted the Bible's teaching that true Christians would not kill their (Spiritual) brothers, (Here's how Christians, of any that kills Christians, of the same or other denominations) and that such actions have shown a lack of true brotherhood on the part of these religions (Loyalty to the nation rather than to that of other denominations) Names) Theology 1 Jehovah's Witnesses believe that Jesus is the Messiah, and the firstborn Son of God, and died for the sins of man in Calvary, as a "sacrifice of redemption", and is the only hope for death and the grave, and was made King of the Kingdom of God. 2 The biblical version that they mainly use is the New World Translation of the Holy Scriptures, their modern translation of the Holy Bible. Although they used various versions of the Bible, the NWT was produced because in their words: "No translation of the Bible can ever be considered definitive. [1] They accept, use, cite, cite other versions and translations of the Bible freely in their literature and sermons, and recognize their value, but the version of the Bible that they mainly use and mostly, read and quote is the NWT (in any language) that is produced by their organization, The Watchtower World and the particular Society of Translation. 3 Jehovah's Witnesses believe that their faith is "the restoration of the beginning of the "Vasa" or of the Christian Congregation. This belief is based on their attempts to align their organizational structure and scriptural interpretation as much as possible to that of the first century Christian congregation. There is no distinction of clergy as in other types of churches, even if there are elderly, superintendents (bishops), and ministerial servants (deacons), and a governing body, in their ecclesiastical structure, and leadership, but all are "brothers" each other, and both male and female members are considered ordained ministers (authorized by God and Christ to teach and preach the word of God 4 Jehovah's Witnesses believe that there is only one God, the Father, whose name is the Eternal, and that Jesus Christ is the firstborn Son of God rather than the Almighty God himself. They teach that references to Jesus as "God" is indefinitely, as in John 1:1, and that Jesus was made "God" or divine on the circumstances, by the Father's permission and power. They do not believe that God is three people or beings in One, but rather a Unique God (which is only the infinite Father) who created all things, and therefore rejects the doctrine of a coequal or coeternal trinity. They support such teachings by using scriptures such as Matthew 4:10, Deuteronomy 6:4, John 14:28, Colossians 1:15, and Psalms 83:18 in their biblical translation where God the Father is spoken as greater than the Son, and refers to how the only Jehovah God alone. 5 Witnesses Refuse the teaching of the immortal soul, but rather teaches that the soul and all the person die waiting for a future resurrection from Christ, resting in the Grave (Hades, Sheol), citing such scriptures as (Ezekiel 18:4) and (John 11:11) as proof that the soul die, and that death can be compared to sleep, without dreaming, and where Activity exists. As such, the Witnesses believe that a place, such as the modern concept of Hell-fire, cannot exist, citing scriptures such as (Matthew 10:28) (that also speak of the soul being destroyed (which is interpreted as annihilation) rather than being consciously tortured forever. They believe in the existence of Heaven, but believe that only God, Christ and the angels, and few chosen from Earth (144.000) will exist in Heaven. 6 Witnesses do not celebrate secular feasts such as Christmas, Easter or Birthdays by pointing out that such feasts were not celebrated by the people of God in the Bible. They also believe that, because © These celebrations have their origin in pagan holidays that dealt with the worship of false gods, true Christians should not be part of them. 7 Witnesses believe that Christ rose from the dead on the third day as a spirit "made alive in the spirit", and that the apparitions to the apostles were materializations, and thus deny the flesh resurrection of Christ. Witnesses interpret the Bible as saying that the soul of Christ was separated from his body, and that Jehovah the Father raised Christ and gave him a new body of glorified spirit, rather than his old being resurrected on the third day. Most of the other professed Christians do not agree, believing that the resurrection of Christ was in his own flesh which he di e d, and not as a spiritual being, and some define the doctrine of the Witnesses on this subject as being heretical. 8 The Witnesses generally do not believe that Jesus died on a traditional cross-shaped fire, but rather that Jesus died on a single piece, or a big wooden stick, a pole, or a big tree limb with both hands over your head. And that the Greek word 'roughly simply means'pole', regardless of form. 9 They observe every year the Lord's Supper, the Last Supper or the Lord's Supper (1 Corinthians 11:20). This event, which they call the Memorial of the Death of Christ, taken from the words of Jesus to the Apostles, "Do this in remembrance of me" (Lc 22,19), falls on the night of Nisan 14, which corresponds to the ancient celebration of Easter celebrated by the Jews, which takes place in March/April of our calendar. 10 According to the doctrine of Jehovah's Witnesses, the Angel of the Lord of Exodus was the pre-existing Christ, and is also identified as the Archangel Michael of Daniel, who guides and protects the people of the covenant of God, and that God made the Archangel Michael, one of the "Sons of God", his incarnate Son, doing it Jesus Christ. Then, having finished his ministry, he returned to heaven and resumed his position as Michael Archangel, a Son of God (Job 1-6; 21; 38:7). Some thirty-year-olds like Charles Spurgeon also taught that Jesus is Michael, but that Michael is God, and co-equal to the Father. Witnesses reject a co-equal Trinity, and teach the supremacy of the Father son (orin all things. This doctrine of Micael is generally carefully held by the Missionary-Ministerial Witnesses leads to door until the converted prospectus is considered receptive, and ready to receive it. [2] Morality Their opinions on morality reflect conservative Christian values. All sexual relations outside of marriage are reasons of expulsion if the individual is not considered repented; Homosexuality is considered a grave sin compared to beastliness or pedophilia, and that same-sex marriages are prohibited. Abortion is considered murder. Modesty in dress and care is often stressed. Gambling, drunkenness, illegal drugs and tobacco use are prohibited. Alcoholic beverages are permitted in moderation. The family structure is patriarchal. The husband is considered the final authority on family decisions, but he is encouraged to urge the thoughts and feelings of his wife, as well as those of his children. Weddings must be monogamous. Divorce is discouraged, and remarriage is forbidden unless divorce is obtained for adultery reasons, called "a scriptural divorce". If a divorce is obtained for any other reason, marriage is considered adultery while the previous spouse is still alive and has not begun another marriage. History The group originated in the 1870s with a movement called Bible students, founded by Charles Taze Russell (1852-1916). He did it in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in 1931. As a young man, Russell was critical of some Christian doctrines, and he was attracted by the teachings of William Miller and other adventurers speculated on the return of the Saviour. During the recurring crisis of the adventurists, when all the dates calculated for the second coming turned out to be wrong, Russell began his movement in the 1870s. Predictions concerning the second coming of a spiritual Lord and the intensive distribution of the literature of the tract and materials "Watchtower" characterize the organization of his group. Russell arranged a Bible lesson to study the scriptures from the ground. The study process involved raising a question, discussing the topic and reviewing all the relevant known scriptures that participants might find on the point. The results have been recorded if they match the long-term theological views. His group was first known as Russellites and then as "International Bible Students". Russell founded The Herald of the Morning (1879), which later became The Watchtower by announcing the Kingdom of Jehovah, then was renamed into Zion's Watch Tower, and now simply The Watchtower, and Zion's Watch Tower Tract Society in 1884.Watchtower Bible and Tract Society). [3] "Judge" Joseph F. Rutherford (1869-1942), a prolific writer, served as second president, 1916/42, and renamed the movement "The Witnesses of Geovah" in Within 1938 there were members 115000, and local churches are becoming more directly organized from the Company's headquarters in Brooklyn. Witnesses are known a l l over the world for their door-to-door preaching that characterizes the use of the Bible and the distribution of the Tower of Control and Awakening' magazine. They do not celebrate parties that are not discussed in the Bible or that feel served to exalt individuals, human organisations or national groups, believing that they are an affront to God. In the 1920s and 1930s the Witnesses entered communities in large numbers, played phonographic records aloud, went door to door looking for potential converts, denouncing organized religion as evil. Dwight D. Eisenhower, whose mother was a witness leader in Kansas, was attacked for his conection. While many of the teachings and practices of the Jehovah's Witnesses were controversial a l due to the conflict with the teachings of the Bible, this was not the only source of controversy Russell faced. On several occasions, Russell was also challenged about his financial motives for managing Geova's Witnesses. In 1879, Russell married Maria Ackley in Pittsburgh. Two years later, the two founded the Bible of the Guardian Tower and the company of Tract and prospered under them. However, Maria left her husband at 1897, and sued for separation in 1903. The following hearing led to some uncomfortable discoveries about Russell, among which the wealth of Russell's various subsidiaries has returned to a holding company that Russell owned. Of that money, Russell received exactly 99% of the profits, with the remaining one% going to his followers. He had no responsibility as to how that money was used.[3] Russell and the Guard Tower were also involved in other activities that appeared to be schemes to make money, such as the Guard Tower advertisement "Miracle Wheat" seed for \$1 per pound (a very high price per day). They argued that it would grow five times more than any other brand of wheat. The Eagle then satisfied this pattern with an animated cartoon, which prompted Russell to denounce the publication for libel. The following legal procedure consisted in having the grain in question analysed, as well as Russell's finances. In the end, it was determined by the court that Russell's "Miracle Wheat" was no different from anyone else, and lost his \$100000 suit. Today, the Watchtower Society argues that Russell never benefited financially from the sale of this "Miracle Wheat", but rather donated the proceeds to the organization. They neglect to mention Russell who owns 990 of the organizations 1000 shares, which means that he has received most of the money donated to the organization.[3] Pledge of Their vision of idolatry led to their refusal to swear allegiance to the flag of the United States of America (or other governments) and participation in military service.[4] .160. The case was brought to the Supreme Court, where the Court ruled in favour of the school board in a written opinion by Judge Felix Frankfurter. The Supreme Court has established that the greeting to the flag can be made obligatory despite religious beliefs. The sentence led to assaults on Geova's Witnesses, three years after the court overturned his sentence against the Witnesses in the West Virginia State Board of Education. "Children" (1943). Witness trials support the thesis that American freedom comes not so much from localities and states that take a stand against a potentially tyrannical federal government as from a legal culture © litigation that puts the Constitution and individual rights above the passions of communities and crowds[5]. The many legal battles waged by Jehovah's Witnesses in the Supreme Court during the 1930s were not random but rather the result of a strategy employed by the leaders of the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society to secure the right to proselytism by winning key causes of the First Amendment in the Supreme Courts. Judge Joseph Franklin Rutherford thought to use the law to strengthen and protect Geova's Witnesses against propaganda bans and mob violence, but it was Hayden Covington of the legal department of the group who actively led witnesses in legal conflicts at national level. Covington deliberately sent Witnesses to areas where their activity was prohibited or unpopular. Witnesses were properly prepared for arrest and received legal guidance on how to obtain their case appeal to the higher courts. The final result of this strategy was that 19 cases concerning Jehovah's Witnesses came to the Supreme Court during the 1939'50s.[6] Canada The Canadian government dealt harshly with Geova's Witnesses during World War II, banning their organization from 1940 to 1943's. Some Witnesses were denied the opportunity to provide alternative service, were enlisted in the army and then imprisoned for pacifism. Jehovah's Witnesses opposed the Canadian government and other Christian faiths, claiming that all governments were controlled by Satan, rejecting any distinction between clergy and lay people and refusing to admit that they belonged to a religious group.[7] Germany and Japan Witnesses were victims of the Holocaust under Nazi Germany. About 20,000's. In Germany in 1933, about 6,000 were arrested. Hundreds of people died from mistreatment in prisons and camps; some were executed.[8] In Japan, all Jehovah's Witnesses were arrested and imprisoned in 1939. The records by the Japanese at the end of the war make it impossible to determine how many survived. The current accounts of torture and brutality mainly concern Japanese converts who refused to serve in the Japanese army because of their religious beliefs. [9] Recent persecutions The success of missionary work has created a presence in many countries, with quick controversy to follow. Opposition to the Witnesses has been manifested in recent years in different countries such as South Korea, Greece, Spain, Chile and various republics of the former Soviet Union, including Russia, Georgia, Ukraine and Uzbekistan. There has been the persecution of Jehovah's Witnesses in Quebec, Canada, because of their refusal to maintain loyalty to a government during the war. Witnesses and Vacations of Geova The Witnesses of Geova base their abstenion from celebrating many popular religious feasts on II Corinthians 6:14, 17 that states: "Do not be cursed together with non-believers, because © What communion has justice with injustice? And what communion has light with darkness? So "Come from among them, and be separate," says the Lord. "And do not touch the unclean thing, and I receive you." (King James version) [10] Although Geova's Witnesses, then known as international biblical students, celebrated Christmas in the early 1900s, this practice stopped in the 1926[11] Since then they have published information on the alleged origins of "pagan" of other parties such as Easter, New Year's, Halloween and others. Their sources have been varied, drawing on the British Encyclopedia, the Catholic Encyclopedia, the World Encyclopedia of the Book, the American Encyclopedia and the resources available in a similar way. As for their position in the secular holidays, the Witnesses of Geova refer to the words of Christ to John 17:16, that his followers would not be part of the world. They also abstain from most celebrations that focus on individuals, such as birthdays, arbitrating scriptures such as Acts 10:25, 26; 12:21-23; Apocalypse 19-10.[12] See also: Witnesses of Geova Although not accepting whole blood transfusions, faith gives members some latitude with regard to blood products, such as plasma, platelets, and red or white blood cells. Since the 1945's ruling organ of Jehovah's Witnesses has established that accepting whole transfusions of blood or integral blood cells is in violation of the Bible's commandments, but in recent years, since 2000's, it has become a matter of conscience to receive "blood products". All adult Jehovah's Witnesses reject all blood, being forbidden by the governing body of the Congregation, basing their vision on the prohibition of the Bible concerning the consumption of blood, with the words "abstain from the blood", with the commandments given under Noah, Moses and Paul, found in the books of Genesis, Leviticus and Acts. In recent decades, an ongoing controversy, especially when they prohibit children from receivingTransfers, which has led many states and countries to ignore parental authority in medical matters. The legal procedure in some of these cases is unsatisfactory to obtain a court order that allows children's transfusion doctors on their parents'objections if blood is believed to lead to death or disability.
