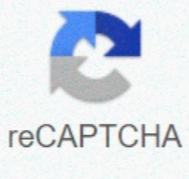

However, it can also be an expensive hobby to get into if you're not sure where to find great deals. If you're a collector looking for some fantastic vintage coins that won't leave you broke, check out these sources first: The first place for old coin buyers to look for great deals should be selling local properties. Collecting coins is a popular hobby among older people, and when that collector dies, his family may not know how much the coins are worth and throw them into the real estate sale. And if you have a metal detector, your chances of finding some outdoors are pretty good. Start in your backyard, especially if you live in an older house. You never know if the previous owner buried something in the yard or just dropped something at some point in time. You can also try the local parks, beaches and abandoned buildings in your community, as long as you're not violating. The old abandoned cemeteries are a great place to visit, because many parishioners have brought their coins for the collection plate at some point in time. Like a real estate sale or antique shop, auctions can be listed by someone who is just trying to get rid of some things and has no idea how much it is worth. Or you can run into a fellow coin collector or dealer who is selling duplicate items or part of their collection cheap to make some extra money. Not every collector is in the same types of coins, so what they don't want can be just what you're looking for. Driving on worn or bald tires is a huge safety hazard. S coins could take about \$177,000 in 2019, but if under certified mint conditions, it could be worth almost \$2 million, aCCOrding to CoinTracker. In 1933, President Theodore Roosevelt signed an executive order requiring all gold coins to be redeemed for paper coin to avoid gold yarding. The coins were melted and converted into gold bars. The 180,000 1927 D St. Gaudens Double The eagle coins which were originally minted fell prey to this order and were reduced to only 11-15. CoinTrackers estimates its value at \$1,200,000 at the beginning of 2019. What makes these coins extremely rare is that only a handful á about 20 or less á were produced in the New Orleans branch of the United States Mint. You could buy one for about \$160,000, if you can find one, or up to \$745,000 if it is in certified mint condition. It appears that a small number of these \$10 coins were issued after President Roosevelt's order in 1933, which banned gold yarding, thus making it technically legal to own the coins. Thirty or 40 may still exist, says Indian Head Eagles, and some have sold as much as \$552,000. A curiosity in the production makes these coins extremely rare. At the date of the coin, the seven in 1817 are stamped on four. Seven out of four are by far the rarest semi-dollar produced at the Philadelphia mint, CoinWeek explains. Eleven are known to exist and can be worth about \$500,000. Most 1901 Morgan Silver Dollars is worth about \$3,000.
