## Is there a call of duty companion app

All the sessions from Transform 2021 are available on-demand now. Watch now. Red Dead Redemption 2 isn't the only new game with a companion app. Activision is launching one for Call of Duty that works with Black Ops 4 and WWII. This app is available for iOS and Android as a free download. While it provides news about the franchise and updates about what your friends are doing, it also provides personalized insights about your play. Each week, the app will update an "action report" that will recap how you've played over the previous seven days. You will also get a briefing that will provide suggestions and tips that the app bases on your performance. To make the data easy to parse, the Companion App visualizes it with plenty of charts and heatmaps. This will help you understand exactly how you are a noob with potato aim. "The Call of Duty Companion App is something that we are very excited for players to use to enhance their gameplay experience," Activision marketing tech boss Gina Hope said. "From connecting you with friends and fellow players, to providing personalized match analysis to checking out your loadouts and competing in challenges with your own squad. It's a new way for players to engage with the game and the community." Why a companion app? This is not the first time Activision has released a companion app for Call of Duty. In 2012, the publisher launched the Call of Duty Elite program with its own app. It, too, provided information about your performance and updates about the game. But the second-screen app concept didn't catch on, and developers seemingly forgot about it. But now it's back, and the reason likely has to do with the live-service business model. Three top investment pros open up about what it takes to get your video game funded. Watch On Demand Call of Duty and Red Dead Redemption 2 both rely on highly engaged players to return to the game to spend money on in-game microtransactions. Or Red Dead will rely on that when its online mode launches into beta later this month. But unlike Fortnite, which has a mobile version, players can lose their connection to an online game if they spend too much time away from it. A companion app enables developers to reach their most dedicated fans with push notifications on their smartphones. If a studio launches an in-game event, they can alert people using the app about that. That could get people to come back, and that could in turn get them to spend more money. Companion App Features Weekly Rewards For Logging In If you log in to the app once every week, you will be given rewards. These rewards are exclusive as you only get them through logging in to the app. The rewards can be anything from calling cards to double XP. You can even get different in-game cosmetics. Available Devices The app is available on both iOS as well as Android devices. Track Your Stats Upon opening the app you will see an overwhelming amount of information which can be filtered down to whatever specific information you want. You can track stats such as headshots, K/D ratio, matches won, matches lost, weekly stats, lifetime stats, specific weapon stats and even battle pass tier progress. Weekly Tournaments Once you log in, you can join a squad of up to 20 other players and complete weekly objectives together, against other squads, for rewards. You will need to work as a team here and win in order to earn the rewards. The objectives can include tasks such as scoring the most kills in Ground War and the top three squads will get the rewards. You can also track your team's progress in the Ops tab to see where your team stands. Social Tab You can see your friends' activity and their kills in the Social tab, under the Feed section. It not only shows your friends' feed but your own as well. You also have the Friend Comparison section where you can compare your score with your friends. There is a Leaderboard section too, which can be filtered either to just your friends and you or to the global leaderboard list. Intel In the Intel tab you can find a lot of useful information such as guides, news and even COD League info, where you can see how well your favorite Call Of Duty competitive team is doing. You will also be able to learn about upcoming events and schedule. Login Options You can log in to the app directly, using your Call Of Duty account, or use one of the platform specific login details such as the Playstation Network, Microsoft, Blizzard Entertainment or Steam. It provides stats on your gameplay in Black Ops 4's multiplayer, Zombies and Blackout (i.e. battle royale) modes, and does the same for WWII's multiplayer, including War Mode. You'll get weekly reports on your performance and personalized advice on how to improve, with factors including a heat map showing you where most of the action is taking place. Activision claims the app will track every shot and movement to help analyze your gameplay. The app also lets you view your friends' stats so you can find out whether you can claim bragging rights for having the best kill/death and win/loss ratios among your peers. You can also form squads of up to 20 players. Your squad can claim in-game rewards such as tags, double XP and rare supply drops for completing weekly objectives. More features, including a loadout manager, localization and chat, will come to the app at a later time. Meanwhile, developer Treyarch has just expanded microtransactions for cosmetic items in Black Ops 4. The COD Points in-game currency arrived on PS4 this week, and it will be available on PC and Xbox One next week. The points allow players to advance through tiers in the Black Market without necessarily grinding out hundreds of hours of playtime. It's a piece of software that runs alongside Call of Duty Warzone and offers you some much deeper insights into a range of statistics and how you match up against other players in your lobby in regards to skill based matchmaking, and more. This also installs the base Overwolf client, which runs in the background and supports a number of games natively. Unfortunately, this is for PC only; there isn't anything like this for console players.When the file is downloaded, simply run it and follow the instructions, then boot up your Call of Duty Warzone client. When you load into Warzone, you'll see all of your stats, from your recent games to how you compare to the global Warzone population in things like kill-death ratio and experience. When you're in a pre-match lobby and during the game, you'll be able to compare your stats directly to the players in your lobby too, which is a great way to see how you stack up and what your odds are at succeeding in the match.Perhaps the best part of the Warzone companion app is that it can detect if there are any cheaters in your lobby. As we all know, hackers have been a rampant problem in Warzone, so the ability to avoid hackers is a huge plus to enjoyment in the game.Note: As a result of players using the app to hack out of lobbies with higher skilled opponents, the companion app has been updated to only show other player stats in your game when you load into the match completely, after the pre-game lobby.Is the Warzone companion app safe to install?(Image credit: Activision)Third-party software always comes with a risk when installing, because most online games don't allow cheats or modifications to the game. While CODStats claims the Warzone companion app is completely safe to use and cannot be treated as a cheat, install it at your own discretion. If you have any doubts whatsoever, refrain from using it as a precaution. Call of Duty now has an official Companion App that can be downloaded here on Android or iOS courtesy of Activision. The app offers free rewards for players of Black Ops 4 and WWII, while giving large groups of friends more incentive to squad up.Rewards for Solos or Squads As soon as you connect your Call of Duty account to the app, you're immediately offered a purse of 500 CoD Points the next time you log in to your preferred game. For Black Ops 4 specifically, that means a few instant tiers on your Contraband stream or a free Special Order. It's not a massive bonus, but it's nice nonetheless. In the Ops section, you can squad up to complete exclusive challenges. Activision The biggest perks can be found in the Ops section, which allows you to join 20-person squads and complete various challenges for reward packages in your game. Possible tasks include getting 4,000 combined kills or 2,000 combined headshots. Players vote on these options, and they're refreshed every few days. If you're successful, you'll earn things like tags, double XP, Rare Supply Drops or discounts on real-world Call of Duty merch.Stat Tracking For the true number-crunching crowd, the Call of Duty Companion App also offers mobile access to many of the stats available on the Call of Duty website. It's possible to track your performance and the performance of squad members via KD ratios, heat maps and more in the Intel and Player sections. Tying it all together, the Home tab keeps you apprised of the latest in-game changes. The Companion App also offers access to all the hot stats you want to know. Activision In short, the Call of Duty Companion App is more or less a free version of the rewards programs supported by your favorite store or service. As long as you enroll, you have the opportunity to get cool stuff. If you're already registered to the Call of Duty website, there's almost no reason to avoid seeing what the Companion App has to offer. There's a chance it may get a little annoying with weekly reports or notifications, but you can always manually disable those if they get too intrusive. The idea of having to clutter up my phone with bloatware, just to get some extra swag in a video game, makes me recoil. However, as I level up past rank 20 of Prestige 1 in Black Ops Cold War, I find myself checking my Call of Duty Companion App more and more often. It's not something I've ever really done before, outside of toying around around with that weird Metal Gear Solid 5 app for a little while, and I'm still trying to understand what's compelled me to actually stay on top of this thing. Honestly, I think a large part of it is my own petty desire to watch my numbers go up. The app tracks your progress across all of your matches, allowing you to see where you're dominating and where there's room for improvement. As somebody who's spent well over a decade of my life trying, year after year, to get more competitive in these games, being able to take a look at my progress on the fly is helpful. The social aspect of the app is also pretty cool. My girlfriend has the Companion App installed on her phone, too, so we'll check each other's progress and get excited for each other's games. When she was outside for a smoke break the other night, she texted me a screenshot of my 3.25 K/D.R in a Free For All match with a "Holy shit babe, nice." She'll get a little shimmer in her eye when she watches her lifetime K/D.R tick up, and traces graphs of her performance from game-to-game. Being able to have those routine interactions with her, and seeing her throw herself at it even more than me, is a huge part of why I dig this thing. A sample of the stats you can look at. (Credit: Activision) I'm also a fan of the Squads feature, which is a more general social aspect. Players can create squads of up to twenty people, and curate who gets to join and who gets the boot. This means that you can create a fun little club for you and your friends, monitoring each other's kill contributions and work towards getting small rewards, like XP bonuses and calling cards. If you're in a group with friends, it's fun to keep track of who's the leader of the pack, and to compliment each other's best games. Plus, there are apparently even more cool features on the way, such as the ability to customize your loadout from the app. As somebody who loves to theorycraft builds and maintain different themed loadouts in this game (all of mine are named after Gunslinger/Girl characters,) the idea of being able to do that on the go makes me just a tad giddy. So, even though companion apps are still a pretty poisoned concept to me, I have to hand it to Activision for putting together such a slick, competent piece of software that actually adds something to my Call of Duty experience. As long as they keep it updated, keep adding features, and keep everything consistent between each new game, I'm excited to keep this thing on my phone for each new game. (Dang, I'm really out here shilling for Call of Duty apps now, huh. What have I turned into?)
